**Program Description** The Associate in Pre-nursing degree consists of a minimum of 93.5 quarter credits earned in General Requirements, Distribution Requirements, and Electives. This degree is designed for students who plan to transfer to Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs at University of Washington (Seattle), Washington State University, Northwest University, Seattle University, Seattle Pacific University, Pacific Lutheran University, Walla Walla University, and the Washington State University Intercollegiate College of Nursing (WSU-ICN) whose members include Eastern Washington University, Gonzaga University, and Whitworth College.

**Credit/Grade Requirements** Students are required to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 in all college-level courses and earn at least 30 college-level (100 level or above) credits at Edmonds Community College.

**Intermediate Algebra Proficiency** This requirement may be satisfied by completion of high school mathematics through second year algebra, completion of MATH 090, or the sequence MATH 091 and MATH 092. NOTE: High school transcripts are not used to determine placement into courses which have an intermediate algebra prerequisite.

**Cultural Diversity** Students pursuing an Associate in Pre-nursing degree must meet the 5-credit Cultural Diversity requirement by completing courses marked as “:CD” on the requirement sheet and/or “Meets Cultural Diversity Requirement” in the quarterly class schedule. Those courses may also be used to fulfill other requirements of the degree.

**Admission Requirements to a University or College** Admission application deadlines vary; students must meet the deadline for the university or college to which they plan to apply for admission to transfer. For admission to nursing as a major, it is critical to note that

grade point average requirements vary and admission is competitive. Certain schools may have additional “university-specific” requirements that are not prerequisites to admission to the Nursing major but will have to be completed prior to graduation and/or commencement of nursing courses. Certain schools may have additional “university-specific” requirements for admission to the institution that are not prerequisites specifically identified in the requirements for the Associate in Pre-nursing degree.

**Contact with advisers from individual schools for institutional requirements is highly recommended**  
*Students completing this degree who have also met specific institutional grade point average requirements and/or any university-specific requirements will be regarded as having the minimum preparation for consideration for admission to a Bachelor of Science Nursing program to the colleges and universities listed in the program description.*

### Students Are Advised To

- Consult with a faculty adviser quarterly. If transferring to a four-year institution, you should consult with the appropriate department at the intended transfer school for entrance requirements. For more information or to schedule an advising appointment call 425-640-1458
- Review the college catalog for required course prerequisites and include these in schedule planning
- At least three quarters before you plan to graduate, contact any college(s) where you have earned credits and have your official transcript(s) sent to Edmonds Community College
- Submit an “Evaluation Request-Transfer Credits” form (available in Enrollment Services) to activate the process of transferring credits to Edmonds Community College

**Graduation Application** A completed Graduation Application form must be submitted to Enrollment Services by the 10<sup>th</sup> day of the quarter in which the student expects to graduate. ### Quantitative or Symbolic Reasoning

- Students who plan to attend University of Washington (Seattle) must also take MATH 140, MATH &141 or PHIL &106. Students who plan to attend Seattle University must also complete MATH 140 or MATH &141.

### HLTH/PE

- HLTH 105 is strongly recommended.

### Distribution Requirements

- Students must select from at least three **(3)** departments/disciplines within this distribution area. It is recommended that students include COMM 101 as one of the Humanities distribution courses. A maximum of five **(5)** credits in Performance/Skills courses may be applied. (Performance/Skills courses are listed under Humanities on the Distribution Requirements List). A maximum of five **(5)** credits in foreign language at the 100 level may be applied. Students who plan to attend University of Washington should not select Journalism courses.
- Students must select from at least three **(3)** departments/disciplines within this distribution area. PSYC& 100 and one Sociology course are required.

Recommended courses include ANTH& 215 and SOC 150 or SOC 200.

### Other

- A five-credit course in Developmental Lifespan Psychology is required.

Some BSN programs may accept only one of these classes; students should check with the program(s).

Students are advised to consult with a faculty adviser quarterly. If transferring, you should consult with the appropriate department at the intended transferring school for entrance requirements.
