Credit/Grade Requirements This ATA degree requires successful completion of a minimum of **96** credits as outlined. A minimum of 30 credits or onethird of the required credits, whichever is less, must be earned at Edmonds Community College. Students are required to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in all college-level courses.

General Education/Related Instruction

Requirements Students who complete degrees or certificates of 45 credits or more are required to demonstrate learning in the following general education/related instruction areas: communications, computation/quantitative skills, and human relations/group interaction.
