Program Description The Associate of Applied Science-T Degree is a program designed for students entering the Hospitality industry or changing careers and who are interested in earning a Bachelor's Degree in Hospitality Management.

This Associate in Applied Science-T (AAS-T) is a **116** credit professional technical degree with a core of general education courses commonly accepted in transfer (25 credits) as well as professional technical courses (69 credits). This degree is accepted at South Seattle Community college as a direct transfer degree into their Bachelor's of Applied Science (BAS) Degree in Hospitality Management. Students seeking to transfer to degree programs other than those specifically designed for the AAS-T should consider the Associate of Arts or the Associate of Science degree, which are specifically designed for transfer to four-year colleges and universities.

Credit/Grade Requirements The AAS-T degree is awarded upon completion of 116 credits as outlined. A minimum of 30 credits or one-third of the required credits, whichever is less, must be earned at Edmonds Community College. Students are required to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in all college-level courses as well as a minimum grade of 2.5 in all hospitality classes.

Culinary Arts Transfer to Bachelors of Applied Sciences at South Seattle Community College Associate in Applied Science-T Degree Program Requirements 2011-2012

Cultural Diversity Edmonds Community **College** requires that students earning a degree or certificate of 45 credits or more meet the Cultural Diversity Requirement. Courses that satisfy this requirement are marked as ":CD" on the requirement sheet and/or "Meets Cultural Diversity Requirement" in the quarterly class schedule.

Transfer of Credit Non-Culinary Arts credits will transfer from any accredited college to satisfy all non-culinary arts requirements. To transfer students must request an evaluation of their college transcripts through the college registration office. This should be done during the student's first quarter at the college.

Students are Advised to

- Consult with a Culinary Arts faculty adviser quarterly for course selection and completion of degree requirements and plan their schedule several quarters in advance.
 Note: All decisions on selection of courses are ultimately the responsibility of the student
- Review the college catalog for required course prerequisites and include these in schedule planning
- All students who intend to transfer should meet with an adviser of the college they plan to transfer to review exact and specific admission requirements

- Program Lecture Requirements: 26 credits must be earned from courses listed under III. Credits will transfer as required and elective courses.
- Program Lab Requirements: 62 credits must be earned from courses listed under IV. Credits will transfer as required and elective courses.
- 3. **English Composition Requirement:** Five (5) credits must be earned in English Composition. This requirement may be satisfied by completion of ENGL& 101.
- 4. Humanities Requirements: Ten (10) credits in humanities are required and may be selected from the Distribution Requirements list. Choices must include a minimum of two different course prefixes, and with no more than 5 credits each of world language at the 100 level.
- 5. MATH& 107 or any college level transferable Math course. Check Math course descriptions to ensure prerequisites are met.
- South Seattle Community College Bachelor of Applied Science in Hospitality Management – requires students to complete 1,000 hours of practical experience to graduate, 360 hours (12 credits) can be completed at Edmonds Community College.
