Program Description Family Support studies is a unique program at the college which has received national recognition. Coursework provides education and training to students currently working or desiring to work with individuals and their families using Family Support practice and principles. The approach nurtures families' healthy development by looking at families' strengths, connecting families to community resources, and supporting and empowering parents to become advocates for their families.

This Associate in Applied Science-T (AAS-T) is a 93 credit professional technical degree with a core of general education courses commonly accepted in transfer. Professional-technical degrees are not designed for transfer to other colleges or universities. Several four-year colleges and universities have specific bachelor's degree programs that accept the AAS-T degree: Evergreen State College, Antioch University, Seattle Pacific University, University of Phoenix, and City University.

Students seeking to transfer to degree programs other than those specifically designed for the AAS-T should consider the Associate of Arts or the Associate of Science degree, which are specifically designed for transfer to four-year colleges and universities.

Credit/Grade Requirements The AAS-T degree is awarded upon completion of 93 credits as outlined. A minimum of 30 credits or one-third of the required credits, whichever is less, must be earned at Edmonds Community College. Students are required to maintain a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 in all college-level courses. Students who have completed core course work for a human services or early childhood degree may only need to complete the 20 FSS credits specific to the Family Support AAS-T requirements.

## General Education/Related Instruction Requirements

 Students who complete degrees or certificates of 45 credits or more are required to demonstrate learning in the following general education/related instruction areas: communications, computation/quantitative skills, and human relations/group interaction. All courses in the general education component of the AAS-T must be generally transferable courses and they must assure that the student have a foundation in communication and quantitative skills as well as an introduction in science, social science and humanities. These courses may also serve the dual purpose of meeting industry requirements for job preparation.

Cultural Diversity Edmonds Community College requires that students earning a degree or certificate of 45 credits or more meet the Cultural Diversity Requirement. ## Distribution Requirements

2. English Composition Requirement: Five (5) credits must be earned in English Composition. This requirement may be satisfied by completion of ENGL\& 101.
3. Social Science, Humanities, Science Requirements: Ten (10) credits in social science, humanities, or science are required and may be selected from generally accepted transfer courses.
4. Program Requirements: $\mathbf{3 0}$ credits must be earned from courses listed under III. Credits will transfer as required and elective courses.
5. General Electives: The remaining credits can be selected from any professional technical or transfer program with a course number of 100 or higher. Those recommended by the department are listed under IV. Credits will transfer as required and elective courses.
